CHINA'S PARTICIPATION IN THE INTERNATIONAL COMMERCIAL DISPUTE RESOLUTION MECHANISM, UNDER THE CONTEXT OF THE BELT AND ROAD INITIATIVE

"Belt and Road" Initiative (BRI) constitutes an assertive strategy which offers a China-driven model of transnational connectivity and partnership. Besides a grand strategy of global economic order, BRI to some extent is more like a moral claim or preaching, which spreads BRI spirit (including the Chinese value) to the rest of the world. From the legal perspective, China has clearly expressed its commitment to the legal protection of BRI implementation, of which commercial dispute resolution is the core. Based on the current boom in international commercial courts in the Eurasian adjudication business, the establishment of the China International Commercial Court (CICC) can be seen as one of China's main achievements in BRI rule of law development. It is against the background that this research aims to study the commercial dispute resolution mechanisms (DRM) used in the context of the BRI, which offers a fertile ground to grasp the ways in which China engages with international rule of law development in general and global commercial DRM in particular.
